



Parents and Spectators General Code of Behaviour



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1. Parents and spectators have a great influence on children's enjoyment and success in football. All children play football because first and foremost they love the game - its fun. It is important to remember that however good a child becomes at football, it is important to reinforce the message to both parents and spectators alike that positive encouragement will contribute to:
 - Children enjoying football
 - A sense of personal achievement
 - Self-esteem
 - Improving the child's skills and techniques
2. A parent's/spectator's expectations and attitudes have a significant bearing on a child's attitude towards:
 - Other players
 - Officials
 - Managers
 - Spectators

Please ensure that you are always positive and encourage all the children, not just your own

3. Parents/spectators should also:
 - Applaud the opposition as well as your own team
 - Avoid coaching your child during a match
 - Not to shout and scream
 - Not berate children in public
 - Respect the Referee's decisions
 - Give attention to each child involved not just the most talented
 - Adhere to your club's Code of Conduct policy
