<u>Lassen-Feather River Loop</u>	Do the Loop! Drive the scenic highways linking Lassen Park with Highway 70's spectacular Feather River Canyon. You will follow an ancient trail through the land of the Mountain Maidu Indians and pass through the old Gold Rush and lumber towns of Chester, Westwood, Greenville, Crescent Mills and Taylorsville. The mountain landscape, rugged and uniquely beautiful, abounds with Maidu stories. See the park, see the canyon and see the enchanted world that lies between them!	<i>Pick up Lassen-Feather River Loop Map at Museums &amp; Visitors Centers</i>
<u>Collins Nature Trail</u>	Easy walk. This trail makes two loops through second growth woodland and grassy flood plain. The far end of the trail is six tenths of a mile from the Park. There are four benches at places along the trail and twelve numbered points corresponding to information on the Trail Guide.	<i>Trail Head at Chester Park, Trail Guide at Collins Museum</i>
<u>Walking Tour of Historic Chester</u>	Enjoy an historic walking tour of Chester, settled by ranchers and dairymen first drawn to the lush grasses of Big Meadows during the 1850's.	<i>Tour Guide at Chester Museum &amp; Visitor Centers</i>
<u>Walking Tour of Historic Greenville</u>	Mountain Maidu Indians had been living in Indian Valley for centuries when Anglo settlers arrived in the 1850's. Take a walking tour of Historic Greenville, where many of the buildings of these first settlers still stand.	<i>Tour Guide On Web Only</i>

<p><u>Walking Tour of Historic Westwood</u></p>	<p>Take a walking tour of Historic Westwood, home to the Red River Lumber and Fruit Growers Companies.
