A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Dear Church Family,

It's been a hard winter this year. The temperatures have been quite cold, depleting the supply of propane and making it more challenging to enjoy being outdoors. Many of us have struggled with sickness, and for some, the struggle goes on. Our church building has taken a beating by the wind that whips through town. The national and world news has been relentlessly heavy, with one tragedy following another.

Paul's words in 2 Corinthians 4:8-9 may reflect the way we are feeling. *"We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."* It is when things are not going well that the light of God can shine out from the cracks in our lives. Death may have been staring Paul in the face, but in it, he saw the beautiful eyes of Jesus.

We are in the last throws of winter, and spring will come this month. Darkness is waning; the light is growing. And so it is when we look at our world with spiritual sight. Death did not have the last word for Jesus, and neither will it have the last word for us. Resurrection will transform our worn bodies into gleaming reflections of God's glorious light, just as they did for Christ.

Let's not focus on the hardships that have a way of piling up, but courageously choose an eternal perspective. Paul encouraged us to **look beyond** so *"we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."* (2 Corinthians 4:16-17).

My tears that day were tears of comfort and peace. The woman who chose the hymn that day said she wasn't sure why she picked it. Now we know!

The next day I told Jeanne's God Mother. She said they sung the same hymn the same day at her church.

Also, when my sister and her family were traveling to Jeanne's memorial service they were listening to a Christian radio station. You expect to hear gospel music on a Christian station. But once again God's timing was perfect. They were blessed with "It Is Well with My Soul".

I recently attended a retreat with the Christian Veterinary Mission. The theme was PEACE.

It's not just the lyrics of the hymn that are important. The reason it was written is also very meaningful. Horatio Spafford was a business man from Chicago. He lost much of his business in the Chicago fire. And his son died.

In 1873 he and his wife decided to take a trip to Europe. Last minute business prevented him from leaving at the scheduled time. He sent his wife and four daughters ahead. He would join them shortly. The ship his wife and daughters were on was rammed by another ship and sunk in 12 minutes. His wife was rescued. His daughters were not.

As soon as possible he was on a ship to join his wife. When they arrived at the location where his daughters were lost the captain told him, "This is the place". That inspired him to write "It Is Well with My Soul".

Jesus said that he will give us his peace. He certainly does!!

We continue to struggle with our available funds to support local, regional and international missions needs that we evaluate and consider worthy causes for us to support. In April we will collect our America for Christ Offering, but also plead for assistance with our church Missions income. Please consider in your heart what you may be able to contribute to our ongoing efforts.

We continue to sponsor our child from Zimbabwe, Leon Nyakunhwa, at a cost of \$35.00 per month. We received a Christmas Card from Leon which is posted on the bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall. We are proud of his progress and the fine young man he has grown into.

To date, more than \$770,000 has been pledged and they are requesting a final push to meet the campaign goal. On March 18th we will accept a special offering for anyone wishing to contribute to this cause. We will have special offering envelopes available to you. If you write a check, make it payable to First Baptist Church and write "Puerto Rico" in the memo line. Please continue to pray for the people of Puerto Rico and how you may assist in the recovery effort. Thank you to those who have already contributed and please consider if you could do more.
