



As a part of the Hearts With A Mission Community I wanted to let you know how valuable you are to our mission of serving homeless, runaway, at-risk and transitional youth by providing shelter and supportive services. Your prayers and support will be necessary to continue to provide hope for the kids and their families we are so blessed to serve. This is an unprecedented time and we wanted you to know our priority is to do our part in keeping our entire communities safe and healthy.

Here are a few of the precautions we are taking as we continue to monitor current information and respond to the evolving situation. As a licensed child caring facility in the State of Oregon we are diligently adhering to:

- All state, local, and federal government mandates.
- We will follow all recommendations by the World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention.
- We are asking to have as few visitors inside the shelters as possible, which includes meal volunteers.
- Volunteers will not be allowed to enter the shelter during this time.
- Only approved visitors by the State of Oregon will be allowed in the shelter.
- Everyone (youth, staff, approved visitors) must immediately wash their hands upon entry to the shelter.
- All large group outings have been suspended and youth recreational opportunities will be limited to outdoor activities as much as the weather allows!
- Youth and staff temperatures are monitored daily, along with their medical well-being.
- No one with cold or flu symptoms will be allowed into the shelters, including staff.
- We have tripled our cleaning and disinfecting efforts.
- Combined staff meetings & Community dinners have been suspended.
- Our Annual Homeless 2 Hopeful Superhero fun run has been postponed.

Please join us as we pray for our Nation and our leaders to provide God's wisdom and direction during this time.
