Happy fall from all of us at IVCS D! As the cold weather sets in, we begin to build fires in our fireplaces that have been ignored over several months. Flue fires can occur and cause disastrous results. Please have your chimney checked now before the burning season is in full swing!

The District has approved an annual payment on your water and/or sewer service charge. October is the time to pay the annual fee, which provides a 10% discount on only the service charge. If you take advantage of this discount, the District will bill quarterly for the water use fee and other related water/sewer fees. The annual charge for the water service charge is \$451 and for sewer is \$253. Therefore, in Greenville, the annual service charge fee for water & sewer is \$704. This is a savings of \$77! Another exciting opportunity happening is our ability to apply for a State Parks Grant to improve Greenville Community Park. The California Youth Soccer and Recreational Development Grant allows us to add or improve soccer, baseball and basketball facilities in our park. One idea is to convert one of the baseball fields into a collegiate softball field. Another is to add a soccer field to the park.
